44-bed inpatient treatment program. Provide ASL interpreting services to Deaf and Hard of Hearing patients and support from Deaf peer counselors. Treatment aims are to provide a psychologically and physically safe environment for recovery, facilitate stabilization of patient emotionally and physically, explore choices and motivation for sober living, develop strategies and resources to carry out change, facilitate chemical dependency education and information services.

Outpatient Programs & Sober Houses

Deaf Community Services – Signs of Life Program (SOL), San Diego, California

Comprehensive outpatient drug and alcohol treatment for Deaf, Deaf-blind, late-deafened, and hard of hearing adults. Offers short- and long-term outpatient services including individual and group alcohol and drug counseling, case management, dual diagnosis (alcohol/drug and mental health) care, assessment, information, and referrals.

Sober living: - Signs of Change SOL has a sober house for deaf males in a 5 bed room house with a live in deaf house manager. They have 8 beds for D/HH males in the house. The clients travel to SOL for groups etc. via public transportation and then go to AA meetings together.
